**Adults who have spent their whole lives in the United States are often ill-prepared to work with children from a different country, community, culture, and way of being...**

Building off of the first workshop on Sept 1<sup>st</sup>, part 2 of this 3 part **online** series, introduces a practical and workable child-centered approach to trauma-informed pedagogy based on four components: Talk, Trust, Feel, and Repair.

Using an adapted model of response to intervention called “Trauma-Sensitive Response to Interventions for Behavior” as its foundation, this workshop sets forth a process in which schools, communities, and systems can readily emulate to achieve culturally responsive, emotionally safe, and overall brave spaces.

With an focus on race-based and COVID-19 related trauma, we’ll intentionally spend a portion of this workshop on how to avoid burnout and compassion fatigue in order to adequately support the children in their care.

Join us as we tie together the information presented in part 1 with the information in part 2 to expand our roles as trauma-informed activists.

On Sept 15<sup>th</sup>, this discussion will be focused on ways we can continue to:

- Build children’s and adult’s resilience to achieve success in school and life
- Support professionals working with Immigrant, Refugee, and Dual-Language learners
- Lead with an anti-racist lens
- Embed restorative practice into our practice
- Leverage a multi-tiered structure to support behavioral, socio-emotional, and academic success for children and adults
- Advocate for transformationist teaching
- Take care of ourselves and our colleagues
